

LRT weekend service interruptions ahead of Metro Line

The Edmonton Transit System (ETS) is performing a series of system upgrades and testing in preparation for start of LRT service on the Metro Line (North LRT to NAIT) in 2014.

Most of the work will be located in two areas; the Health Sciences/Jubilee area at the tail track and just north of Churchill Station at the junction for the track leading to NAT. Some of these tests will require a shutdown of larger areas. ETS will be working on overhead power lines and testing signal systems. The disruptions will consist of sections of single tracking or targeted shut-downs requiring bus replacement service.



In an effort to reduce the effect on commuters, the majority of the work will be concentrated on weekends until February 2014.

On some Sunday mornings until January 2014, LRT will be replaced by buses for a portion of the line. Some weekend shutdowns are also tentatively scheduled. Plans can change depending on how the tests progress. ETS will endeavour to provide as much advance notice as possible and make every effort to limit disruptions to the least busy times on the system.

Current service information will be available on the ETS website at <u>takeETS.com</u> and posters will be installed on the system for each disruption.

Thank you for your patience as ETS prepares for the start of service on the Metro Line (North LRT to NAIT).
