

Where to Vote notices drop in Edmonton mailboxes

Every Edmonton household should receive a Where to Vote notice in the mail by the end of the week. These notices will advise occupants of the voter eligibility requirements, where to find their <u>Advance Vote</u> and <u>Election Day</u> voting station, and <u>what candidates are running in their</u> ward.



Residents are encouraged to share the information contained in the notice with all eligible voters at their address. Edmontonians can also use the <u>where to vote tool</u> online at <u>edmonton.ca/election</u> to locate their Election Day voting station.

"This notice and the online tool will help ensure all voters are informed about their voting options," says Alayne Sinclair, Returning Officer for the 2013 Edmonton Election. "I'd also like to take this opportunity to remind voters that the identification requirements have changed for this year's election. In order to vote, you must present one piece of ID that establishes both your name and current residential address, such as an Alberta Driver's Licence, utility bill or bank statement," adds Sinclair.

Residents can visit <u>edmonton.ca/election</u> for voter eligibility requirements and the complete list of authorized identification.

Eligible voters who are unable to cast their ballot at their neighborhood voting station on October 21, 2013 can still take advantage of the <u>advance voting</u> taking place at City Hall or at their designated ward voting station from today until October 12, and October 15 to 19, 2013. Voting stations will be open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Hours will be extended from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Thursday, October 10 and 17.

All advance vote locations will offer voters with special needs the opportunity to vote independently using an AutoMARK, which is an electronic ballot marking device.

Voters who will be out of the cityor who are unable to reach their voting station due to a disability also still have time to request a <u>mail-in ballot</u>. Call 780-442-VOTE or apply online at <u>edmontonspecialballot.com</u>.
