Architectural excellence honoured at Edmonton gala

The City of Edmonton's Urban Design Awards winners were announced and celebrated on November 22, 2013 at City Hall

The jury gave out five awards of excellence and three awards of merit to architects and designers who developed distinctive concepts in six categories

value of good design and its importance in creating more enduring, distinct and memorable urban places that make up a great city," says Toronto urban designer Mark Reid, one of this year's judges. The five awards of excellence went to:

- Urban Architecture category: Commonwealth Community Recreation Centre and Edmonton Eskimo Orban Architecture Category: Commonwearth Community Recreation Centre and Edmonton Eskil Field House – MacLennan Jaunkalns Miller Architects and HIP Architects
 Urban Fragments category: Talus Dome – Edmonton Arts Council/Ball Nogues Studio
 Community-Based Projects category: Dirt City :: Dream City – Edmonton Arts Council
 Community-Based Projects category: LIVINGbridge – Chelsea Boos, Carmen Douville, Erin Ross
 Student Projects category: Rossdale Park and Interpretive Centre – Teague McCrae

The three awards of merit went to:

- Urban Architecture category: Jasper Place Library Dub Architects and Hughes Condon Marler
- Architects Urban Architecture category: The Alberta Hotel – Dub Architects
 Civic Design category: Edmonton Clinic Site Development – Dialog

For the first time, the public had a chance to vote for the People's Choice Award. The all-new category was created to recognize examples of good urban design that have had a transformative impact on our quality of life in Edmonton. With over 400 votes, the People's Choice Award went to MacEwan University downtown.

"Urban design and architectural excellence play an important role in maintaining and enhancing the quality of life in our city," says Gary Klassen, General Manager of the City's Sustainable Development Department. "It's important to celebrate achievements in building a livable, sustainable, beautiful city through excellent urban design and appealing public spaces."
