

Parking Ban Extended

Continuous heavy snowfall means no parking on designated routes

With the heavy snowfall experienced Thursday night and more snow expected Friday, the City of Edmonton has extended the parking ban on residential bus routes until further notice.

"Crews need to be able to plow from curb to curb to remove newly accumulated snow and avoid the dangerous narrowing of traffic lanes," says Bob Dunford, Director of Roadway Maintenance.



Vehicles still parked on designated parking ban routes are subject to tagging and towing for as long as the ban is in effect, so that roadway maintenance crews can move as quickly as possible through Edmonton. The ban will remain in effect until the plowing cycle is complete across the city.

Residents are encouraged to stay informed about the status of the parking ban and other winter road maintenance activities by monitoring local media, checking the City of Edmonton website, keeping tabs on the City's Twitter and Facebook accounts, watching for digital message boards and transit electronic messaging, and by signing up for email notifications (link is available on edmonton.ca/snowparking).

"We understand that the parking ban may cause temporary inconvenience for some residents," adds Dunford. "However the removal of parked vehicles means that we are able to do the best job possible. We thank everyone for their cooperation."
