City of Edmonton releases new Maps website

The City of Edmonton has officially launched the new, significantly-improved Edmonton Maps site. Provided as a beta release in November 2013, the development team has received feedback and suggestions from early users to put the finishing touches on the new site.

"Our mapping system was leading-edge when it was established 10 years ago, and we just brought it back to that level using current technologies," according to Keith Chorley, Director of the City's IT Enterprise Solutions

Previously, the City's map site required users to access it through Internet Explorer with an Adobe SVG Plugin. Edmonton Maps can now be accessed through most major desktop browsers (Internet Explorer, Google Chrome, Mozilla Firefox and Apple Safari) without installing additional plugins.

Just a few of the things Edmonton Maps can be used for includes finding addresses, property assessments, garbage-pickup schedules, bus routes, development applications and area zoning.

To find the new Edmonton Maps site go to maps.edmonton.ca. There is a report-a-bug tool on the new site's homepage that can be used to provide feedback or enhancement suggestions as well as report any issues uncovered while working with the site.
