10 days left to review your property's assessed value

The deadline for filing formal property assessment complaints is **March 10, 2014**. The City encourages Edmonton property owners to use the following resources to learn more about the assessment process.

Online resources

Assessment details specific to your property. Our [secure site for property owners](#) gives you access to reports on physical characteristics and assessment details of your property and property sales information.

Forms. Access our [forms](#) if you wish to change your mailing address, declare school support, sign up for a [Property Tax Monthly Payment Plan](#) or submit other changes that require your signature.

Maps. Browse our [maps](#) to review basic assessment information about Edmonton properties and see what municipal facilities and services are available within your neighbourhood.

One-on-one support

If you've come across an error in your assessment notice, contact us first. Most assessment-related concerns can be resolved by speaking with a 311 agent or an assessor—with no formal complaint fees required.
