## 10 days left to review your property's assessed value

The deadline for filing formal property assessment complaints is **March 10, 2014**. The City encourages Edmonton property owners to use the following resources to learn more about the assessment process.

#### Online resources

Assessment details specific to your property. Our <u>secure site for property owners</u> gives you access to reports on physical characteristics and assessment details of your property and property sales information.

Forms. Access our <u>forms</u> if you wish to change your mailing address, declare school support, sign up for a <u>Property Tax Monthly Payment Plan</u> or submit other changes that require your signature.

Maps. Browse our maps to review basic assessment information about Edmonton properties and see what municipal facilities and services are available within your neighbourhood.

#### One-on-one support

If you've come across an error in your assessment notice, contact us first. Most assessment-related concerns can be resolved by speaking with a 311 agent or an assessor—with no formal complaint fees required.

If you disagree with your property's assessment, you can file a formal complaint with the <u>Assessment Review</u> Board.

Remember you can appeal your property's assessment, but you cannot appeal the amount of property taxes stated on your tax notice.
