Late-night parking ban remains on Whyte and Jasper Avenues

[Responsible Hospitality Edmonton](#) and the [Edmonton Police Service](#) are reminding drivers about a late-night parking ban in Edmonton's entertainment zones.

The late-night parking ban has been in place on parts of Whyte and Jasper Avenues on Friday and Saturday evenings since 2007. EPS has placed dark blue hoods over affected parking meters as a visual reminder to bar and restaurant patrons. Now that the ban is well established, and with various other signage in place (such as stickers and sign posts), the police service will no longer be hooding affected meters every weekend.



The ban creates safer conditions for both pedestrians and motorists, ensures easy and prompt taxi access and allows for better traffic flow.

The public is reminded that the ban on Whyte and Jasper Avenues, which makes parking illegal between 103 and 106 Streets on Whyte Avenue and between 107 and 108 Streets on Jasper Avenue between midnight and 6 a.m., is still in place — with or without the hoods. Illegally parked vehicles in these zones will be tagged and are subject to towing.
