- Backyard and schoolyard naturalization – creating wildlife habitat with native plants, backyard food production
- Natural area stewardship – hands-on skills for caring for natural areas
- Creating a culture of stewardship – engaging friends, neighbours and the wider community
- Volunteer opportunities – how you can get involved!

The course will take place June 3-21, 2014, at MacEwan University (City Centre Campus) on Tuesday and Thursday evenings (6:30 – 9:30 p.m.) and full-day Saturdays. The course is free and includes field trips to local natural areas. The deadline for applications is April 22, 2014.
