New walkway improves access to Queen Elizabeth Park

Edmontonians will soon have better access to Queen Elizabeth Park from Saskatchewan Drive and 106 Street with the creation of a new pedestrian trail.

As a part of a larger revitalization of the park, an asphalt walking trail will be built this year. In order to construct the trail, City crews will begin some tree removal and replanting on March 26, 2014. The work will conclude by April 15, 2014.



The urban forest is our city's greatest asset and we are committed to its care, preservation and expansion. Preserving and expanding our urban forest is an important part of the City of Edmonton's long-term strategic goals: *The Way We Green*, *The Way We Live* and *The Way We Grow*.

The completion of the trail is targeted for the end of August.
