Edmonton hosts world's leading-edge traffic safety experts

International Conference on Urban Traffic Safety kicks off with Run Walk Ride 4 Traffic Safety

The City of Edmonton's Office of Traffic Safety, in partnership with the Edmonton Police Commission, is hosting Edmonton's 6th annual International Conference on Urban Traffic Safety from Monday, April 28 to Friday, May 2 at the Shaw Conference Centre.

The only one of its kind in Canada, the conference will see several hundred delegates from around the world gather in Edmonton. Leading-edge traffic experts from 10 different countries will share best practices and discuss the challenges and issues that surround creating a culture of traffic safety in urban centres. Organizers are expecting more than 250 representatives from law enforcement, traffic engineering, academic institutions and community groups at the internationally-renowned event.

Johnston, Ph.D. of the Transport Safety Pty Ltd., Australia (Innovation in Policy and Practice: The Six Cs of Traffic Safety: Wednesday, April 30 at 9 a.m. and a post conference workshop on Road User Behaviour: Why is traffic safety viewed as a minor problem, why road use culture is egocentric and how Ian Walker, Ph.D. of the Department of Psychology, Traffic and Transport, University of Bath, England
- (Sustainable Modes of Transportation: Wednesday, April 30 at 1 p.m.)

The opening ceremony begins at 8:30 a.m. on Monday, April 28 and includes the Edmonton Police Service Honour Guards and the Aboriginal women's trio ASANI. Also in attendance: The Honourable Wayne Drysdale (Mnister of Transportation, Government of Alberta), Gerry Shimko (Executive Director, Office of Traffic Safety), Shami Sandhu, (Chair, Edmonton Police Commission) and Deputy Chief Simpson (Edmonton Police Service). Dr. James Talbot, Alberta's Chief Medical Officer of Health will present the first keynote of the conference, Innovation in Urban Traffic Safety: Working Smarter to Save Lives.
