City Archives launches Humberstone Mine online exhibit

Edmontontians are invited to the launch of the City of Edmonton Archives' latest online exhibit featuring the history of the Humberstone Mine.

The new exhibit allows visitors to explore the history of the Humberstone Mne, which operated in Beverly between 1900 and 1934. It employed hundreds of people, contributed thousands to the local economy, and was an important part of the social, political, and economic life of the community.

The evening will consist of a short presentation on the history of the mine, remarks from Beverly Historical Society President Dan Vriend, and the unveiling of the new exhibit.
