Awards ceremony recognizes Edmonton's top blooms

This year's winner of Edmonton's most beautiful front vard went to a homeowner in **Delwood (7802-132A Ave)**. The annual Edmonton In Bloom Awards, held at City Hall celebrate residents, projects, community groups and volunteers who contribute to a more beautiful, vibrant and liveable Edmonton.

Textures, colours, landscape features and overall characte are just some of the factors considered during judging. Many nominated yards in the general front yard category had unique horticultural and garden features that impressed judges. This year's other winners are:

The Partners in Parks Award was presented to Dawna Wiebe, for 18 years spent maintaining flower beds in Aspen Gardens.

Nearly 3,500 Front Yards in Bloom nominations were received this year, a 49 per cent increase from 2013.
