

Edmonton seeks small boundary adjustment in Sturgeon County

The City of Edmonton is taking steps to acquire roughly 40 acres of land from Sturgeon County in the vicinity of 66 Street NW, north of Anthony Henday Drive. Edmonton City Council authorized Administration to proceed with an annexation application to acquire the land on September 23, 2014.



This will enable a small boundary adjustment to relocate the municipal boundary to include an extension of 66 Street NW and its right-of-way within the City of Edmonton.

"This is a simple and small boundary adjustment application similar to many that have occurred in our region," said Mayor Iveson. "We look forward to working collaboratively with Sturgeon County to complete this application."

The boundary adjustment includes a small undeveloped triangle shaped parcel created by the construction of the Anthony Henday. This parcel will remain undeveloped except for the construction of roadway to provide access to the Edmonton Energy and Technology Park located east of the existing municipal boundary.

Sturgeon County Council authorized their Administration to initiate the process of a municipal boundary adjustment with the City of Edmonton regarding the lands that the City seeks to annex in July.
