Metro Line test trains on the tracks this weekend

Testing taking place between MacEwan and NAIT stations

The City of Edmonton is asking motorists and pedestrians to stay safe while contractors run tests on the at-grade portion of the Metro Line this weekend.

On Saturday, October 4 and Sunday, October 5, between 9 a.m. and 6 p.m., trains will be running between MacEwan and NAIT stations as part of ongoing testing of the new signalling system for the LRT. LRT service will be unaffected.

Intersections along the Metro Line right-of-way will be periodically closed to accommodate train movements. Affected intersections include: 105 Street/105 Avenue, 105 Street/106 Avenue, 105 Street/107 Avenue, Kingsway/104 Street, 111 Avenue/106 Street and Princess Elizabeth Avenue/106 Street. Intersections will be closed for several minutes at a time. Flag people will direct traffic during the closures.

Please stay off the tracks and only cross at designated crossings when permitted.
