Metro Line test trains on the tracks this Saturday

Testing taking place between MacEwan and NAIT stations

The City of Edmonton is asking motorists and pedestrians to stay safe while contractors run tests on the at-grade portion of the Metro Line this Saturday.

On Saturday, October 18, between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m., trains will be running between MacEwan and NAIT stations as part of ongoing testing of the new signalling system for the LRT. LRT service on the Capital Line will be unaffected.

Intersections along the Metro Line right-of-way will be periodically closed to accommodate train movements. Affected intersections include: 105 Street/105 Avenue, 105 Street/106 Avenue, Kingsway/104 Street, 111 Avenue/106 Street and Princess Elizabeth Avenue/106 Street. Intersections will be closed for several minutes at a time. Flag people will direct traffic during the closures.

Please stay off the tracks and only cross at designated crossings when permitted.

The City of Edmonton thanks motorists, pedestrians, businesses and residents for their patience during testing.

Testing of the new signalling system will continue until it is ready to support the operation of the Metro Line, which is scheduled to open to service in early 2015. The system will allow Metro Line and Capital Line trains to safely and reliably share the same tracks from Churchill Station southwards.

The Metro Line represents the next major step towards transforming Edmonton's transportation system. It is expected to add 13,200 weekday riders to Edmonton's LRT network and link major destinations like NAIT, the Royal Alexandra Hospital and MacEwan University to the rest of the network.
