This event is part of the City of Edmonton's Celebrating our Faiths program, a joint initiative with the Edmonton Interfaith Centre for Education and Action. The program, which includes a display at City Hall, is designed to promote greater awareness of the city's diverse faith groups and enhance appreciation of Edmonton's cultural diversity. The Muslim display will be at City Hall until November 4, 2014.
