Extended seasonal parking ban ending

Compliance levels greatly improved over previous years

The City of Edmonton will lift the seasonal parking ban today, Monday, December 1 at 3 p.m.

Although arterial roads were completed by Sunday, November 30, delays caused by hard packed ice on the collector/bus routes required an extension of the seasonal parking ban into Monday afternoon. The extension of the parking ban did not impact the start of the neighbourhood blading cycle, which started at 12:01 a.m. on Monday, December 1 and will continue until 11:59 p.m. on Friday, December 5.

Bylaw Enforcement issued 1825 fines as of the end of the day on Sunday, November 30, the fewest overall number of violations since the ban started in 2011. Over 200 tows were requested. "We've seen a much higher level of compliance, which makes a huge difference in the job we're able to do on the collector/bus routes," said Bob Dunford, Director, Roadway Maintenance. "We'd like to thank everyone who moved their vehicles and allowed crews to do the most efficient job possible."
