Photographer captures transformation of nature through industry

Media are invited to a presentation with one of Canada's most respected photographers, Edward Burtynsky.

Burtynsky is known for his images of mine tailings, quarries, waterworks, factories and other remnants of industry. He shows us nature transformed through industry, a planet made alien by human hands. With Jennifer Baichwal, he has made two award-winning documentary films, *Manufactured Landscapes* (2006) and *Watermark* (2013).

During his presentation, Burtynsky will survey his works in large-scale colour photography and film production, discuss his image-making process as an artist and help us understand our relationship with nature.
