
Date: Saturday, February 21, 2015

The hackathon is part of an $\underline{\text{International Open Data Day}}$ hackfest to encourage the adoption of open data policies by local, regional and national governments worldwide. Citizens in cities from around the world will unite and spend the day using public data to write applications, develop apps and games, create visualizations and publish analyses.

"it's exciting to come together with the City of Edmonton again to provide access to information and promote civic engagement," says Pam Ryan, Director of Collections and Technology at EPL. "After last year's success, plans have grown to also include workshops in addition to the day-long hackathon."

For residents who are interested in open data, but don't know how to 'hack it', EPL will be hosting two hour-long, drop-in workshops at Stanley A Miner Library the week leading up to the hackathon. These sessions, facilitated by Alexandra Carruthers, EPL's Digital Public Spaces Librarian and Matt Dance, Geographer and Open Data Advocate, are designed to provide interested residents with a basic introduction to open data hackathons.
