Wondering what should go in the garbage, in the recycling bag or to an Eco Station? The <u>Urban Recycler</u> newsletter has all the information you need to manage your household waste properly. The newsletter also contains a useful "what goes where" guide that can be removed and kept as a handy sorting reference tool.



The latest edition of the Urban Recycler features the new northeast Eco Station and explains the importance of taking household hazardous waste to any of the city's four Eco Stations.
