

City makes progress on Infill Roadmap

The City of Edmonton has completed 11 of the 23 action items in the [Infill Roadmap](#) and is taking steps to ensure that it addresses concerns of Edmontonians around infill.

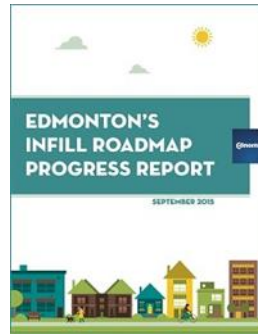
"The 23 action items in the Infill Roadmap create opportunities to support more and better infill across our mature and established neighbourhoods to help realize the City's vision of attractive, vibrant, compact and sustainable communities," said Livia Balone, director of development and zoning services.

Some of the actions that have been completed are the Good Neighbour Guide (Action 5), adding an infill course to Planning Academy (Action 9) and changes in the Zoning Bylaw to increase opportunities for narrow lot houses, garage suites and garden suites (Actions 14 and 15).

The actions in the Roadmap relate to zoning changes, improvements to processes, and how the City communicates and shares information.

Along the way, there have been other infill issues that have been identified. The City is working to adapt and respond to these issues, connecting with residents and the industry to come up with solutions.
