

Bye-Bye Bike Corrals

Popular on-street bike parking will be back next spring

The City of Edmonton is packing up its bike corrals for the winter. Bike corrals provide parking for cyclists in seven locations around Edmonton.

Corrals from six of the locations are coming out tomorrow, while the corral at 102 Street, south of Whyte Avenue, was removed in mid-September due to nearby road construction.

The bike corral program is part of an initiative to create a more bike-friendly environment and to encourage cycling in high traffic areas. Bike corrals are placed in on-street parking spots allowing this space to be set aside for bikes instead of cars.

Bike corrals in Old Strathcona and on 124th Street proved to be popular with cyclists again this year. A new pilot location near The Sugarbowl on 88 Avenue was very well received and will be back again next year, as will most of the other bike parking locations.

Bike corrals were set out seven weeks earlier than in previous years due to the mild spring weather and early roadway cleaning by City maintenance crews.
