Residents will be able to view display material, speak with project team members and provide their feedback. Public input will also be collected through an online survey that will be available for two weeks after each meeting.

The City of Edmonton installed a variety of traffic calming measures in the communities in fall of 2015 to reduce speeding or shortcutting through the neighbourhoods.

The results of the pilot project will be reported back to City Council on March 23, 2016.
