

Questions about your property assessment notice?

Assessment review period ends March 11

Do you have questions about your property assessment notice? Residents and businesses can find out more about their 2016 assessment notice by using one of these resources. The City of Edmonton mailed property assessment notices to property owners in Edmonton in early January. The deadline to file a formal property assessment complaint is March 11.

Online Resources

Assessment details specific to a property. The City's <u>secure website</u> gives property owners access to reports on the physical characteristics and assessment details of their property and sales information of similar properties.

Maps. Property owners can review City maps for basic assessment information about Edmonton properties and see what municipal facilities and services are available within their neighbourhoods.

Forms. Property owners can access City forms if they wish to change their mailing address, declare school support, sign up for the property tax monthly payment plan or submit other changes that require a property owner's signature.

One-on-One Support

Property owners who believe they have identified an error in their property assessment information are invited to contact the City. Most assessment-related concerns can be resolved by speaking with a 311 agent or an assessor—with no formal complaint fees required.

Property owners who disagree with their property assessment information can file a formal complaint with the <u>Assessment Review Board</u> during the <u>assessment review period</u> from January 4 to March 11, 2016.
