Summer daycamps are offered for children ages two to 17. Camp activities include fine and visual arts, sports, science, history, and outdoor skills. Locations throughout the city mean parents can find camps conveniently located near work or home. For youth between 13 and 17, volunteer positions are also available. These positions help youth develop skills and build their resumes.
