



City shares vision for 106 Street and 76 Avenue

The City of Edmonton is hosting an open house to present the concept plan for 106 Street between 61 Avenue and Saskatchewan Drive and 76 Avenue between 104 Street and Saskatchewan Drive. Construction of the project will begin in 2017 and will be done at the same time as Neighbourhood Renewal.

The vision for this project was established in spring 2015 with the aim of transforming 106 Street and 76 Avenue into walkable, bikeable and livable public spaces that connect people. The concept plan being presented at the open house supports this vision.

The presentation and information boards will summarize the work completed, outline the results of public input gathered to date, and present details of the concept plan.

The concept plan was developed through an innovative engagement process. The City of Edmonton partnered with the community group, QACrossroads and formed Engage 106-76, a group which eventually expanded to include members from the City, eight neighbourhoods, and several community organizations that jointly planned and hosted engagement activities over the course of the past year.

Both City staff and community core team members will be available to answer questions and gather feedback.
