The Amiskwacyi History Series is an Indigenous initiative created to build awareness around the often untold Indigenous history of the Edmonton area. Through free monthly educational sessions, the Amiskwacyi History Series aims to provide accessible and culturally appropriate education to the public on Indigenous history as lived and told by the people. The name Amiskwacyi comes from Amiskwacyi Waskahikan or "Beaver Hill House," a Cree term used to describe the Edmonton area.
