 Employer in unpaid employment or volunteer: Svitlana Kadziela and St. Michael's Extended
- Ewen Nelson Self-Advocacy: Robert Macklon

The Mayor's Awards ceremony is presented by the Accessibility Advisory Committee (formerly the Advisory Board on Services for Persons with Disabilities) to citizens who are working to remove barriers to make Edmonton an inclusive city.
