City planners have been visiting the classrooms of students in Grades 4 to 6 across the City and many students have already submitted drawings, which can be viewed on the Infill Design School Program website.

The drawings are meant to inspire architects and designers participating in Edmonton's first ever <u>infill design competition</u> to

think outside the box by exposing them to the ideas, preferences and creativity of young Edmontonians
