



NextGen hosts inaugural City Jam concert

Approximately 200 concert-goers between the ages of 18 and 40 packed the Starlite Room to attend the inaugural NextGen City Jam, a high energy celebration of volunteerism in Edmonton.

Patrons earned admission to City Jam by volunteering a minimum of ten hours with a local organization between August 1, 2016 and November 7, 2016. They completed more than 5600 volunteer hours.

"Volunteering is a way to connect with your community, learn new skills, and build lasting relationships all while helping local organizations deliver important programs and services," said NextGen Coordinator Christine Causing. "Volunteers are shaping the future of our city, and we are proud to support these Edmontonians through the inaugural NextGen City Jam."

Edmonton's NextGen Committee was created in 2006 with the vision of creating a vibrant city shaped by citizens ages 18 to 40. NextGen volunteers work to create a city that attracts and gives voice to the next generation by connecting people, places, communities, and ideas.
