



ETS Stuff a Bus campaign drives out hunger

Edmonton's Food Bank in dire need of donations for holidays

With record numbers of hungry families in need this year, Edmonton Transit System is asking Edmontonians to help drive out hunger by supporting the 22nd annual ETS Stuff a Bus campaign. From November 30 to December 3, ETS volunteers will be accepting and "stuffing" non-perishable food donations in ETS buses at select Save-On-Foods locations and transit centres.

Donations will help the Edmonton's Food Bank provide meals to those in need this holiday season and throughout the coming year. Stuff a Bus will also extend past city limits at the Spruce Grove Save-On-Foods location to support Parkland Food Bank, and the Sherwood Park Save-On-Foods to support Strathcona Food Bank.

Edmonton's Food Bank serves more than 20,000 people per month through hamper programs, 40 per cent of them children.

High demand items include pasta and pasta sauce, macaroni & cheese, canned soups, canned fruits and vegetables, canned fish and meat, and small jars of peanut butter.
