Wilson Bearhead (Nakota) is a member of the Wabamun Lake Indian Band in Treaty 6 territory, Alberta. Wilson has served as a Chief in his community, the Grand Chief of the Confederacy of Treaty 6 First Nations and Alberta Regional Chief for the Assembly of First Nations. He is currently working as an Elder and cultural educator/support with Elk Island Public Schools and Edmonton Public Library.

Through free monthly educational sessions, the Amiskwacy History Series aims to provide accessible and culturally appropriate education to the public on Indigenous history as lived and told by the people. The name Amiskwacy comes from Amiskwacy Waskahikan or "Beaver Hill House," a Cree term used to describe the Edmonton area.
