Wilson Bearhead (Nakota) is a member of the Wabamun Lake Indian Band in Treaty6 territory, Alberta. Wilson has served as a Chief in his community, the Grand Chief of the Confederacy of Treaty6 First Nations and Alberta Regional Chief for the Assembly of First Nations. He is currently working as an Elder and cultural educator/support with Elk Island Public Schools and Edmonton Public Library.

Through free monthly educational sessions, the Amiskwaciy History Series aims to provide accessible and culturally appropriate education to the public on Indigenous history as lived and told by the people. The name Amiskwaciy comes from Amiskwaciy Waskahikan or "Beaver Hill House," a Cree term used to describe the Edmonton area.
