

## Contest: Treaty No. 6 Recognition Day needs artists! Big or small, we're putting out the call to you

Indigenous and non-Indigenous people of all ages in Treaty No. 6 territory are invited to participate in an art contest for Treaty No. 6 Recognition Day. Treaty No. 6 Recognition Day is an annual event that recognizes Edmonton's partnership with the Confederacy of Treaty No. 6 First Nations.

Starting today, amateur or seasoned artists and hobbyists are encouraged to create pieces in the spirit of celebrating local First Nations' achievements and contributions. This year's



theme is: "As long as the sun shines, the waters flow, and the grass grows." Contest guidelines, submission forms and details of the contest requirements can be found online. All submissions must be received by Friday, August. 4, 2016 at 11:00 p.m.

Winners will be selected in three categories: child, youth and adult. Elders will select the winning art pieces that will be exchanged at this year's Treaty No. 6 Recognition Day to the Grand Chief and the Mayor. Each category winner will receive a \$500 prize.

The City of Edmonton and Confederacy of Treaty No. 6 First Nations envisioned and planned ongoing recognition to Treaty No. 6 that commemorates the signing of Treaty No. 6 between the Plains, Wood Cree, Nakota, Saulteaux and Dene people and the Crown at Fort Carlton on August 23, 1876. Treaty No. 6 Recognition Day recognizes Edmonton's connection with the First peoples of this land. Edmonton was founded in Treaty No. 6 territory.

Treaty No. 6 Recognition Day is August 18, 2017.
