- May 6 at Buena Vista Park and Dawson Park from 1-2 p.m.

The City's dogs off-leash ambassadors and animal control officers will be at each location to welcome volunteers and provide a safety orientation. Gloves, water, bags, snacks, an information piece and a token of appreciation will be given to everyone who attends.
